Dear School Club Roundup Participant:

The certificates are being mailed this week for the October 2012, February 2013 School Club Roundup sessions. If you participated in both the two certificates should be together with this letter. This may be the slowest turn around time we have done. Those who sent labels and postage or self addressed stamped envelopes go out first. Thank you for your participation and your patience.

Thanks, especially to those who sent in donations to offset some of the expense for those who did not send postage. We hope to see you back October 21-25, 2013. See October 2013 *QST* for the results article. The updated rules have been posted. Scores have been or will be posted shortly at <http://www.arrl.org/school-club-roundup> and scr.limarc.org.

There are no major changes in SCR operating rules for Fall 2013. The ten Canadian Provinces will again be counted as multipliers the same as the U. S. States. The Canadian Territories are now counted separately, based on the advise from the RAC.

Please note: Although Canada, United States, Alaska and Hawaii are separate DX entities, they do not count as country multipliers for SCR. Log all of these contacts as either states or provinces or territories. (Alberta AB; British Columbia BC; Manitoba MB; New Brunswick NB; Newfoundland and Labrador NL; Northwest Territories NT; Nova Scotia NS; Nunavut NU; Ontario ON; Prince Edward Island PE; Quebec QC; Saskatchewan SK; Yukon YT.) The District of Columbia is logged as Maryland.

If you need a sample log page, please download it and other info such as tips, suggestions and an FAQ page from Groups.Yahoo.com/groups/SCR-L. If you need anything else, please write to the above address or e-mail SCR@limarc.org.

Our published Cabrillo format template was used by an increasing number of entries. See www.arrl.org/school-club-roundup. It is supported by the newest versions of SCR-Log, LogIt!, GenLog325 and N1MM and some other popular logging programs. We urge you to use an updated version of one of these logging programs. Anything older than October 2012 produces reports that are not fully compatible with our scoring process. If you have a favorite logging program, ask the author to add support for the SCR. We hope it will help to reduce the amount of manual entry we need to do. Send comments directly to the authors with copies to scr@limarc.org. Also, check Groups.Yahoo.com/groups/SCR-L or the SCR-L@yahoo.com e-mail or www.arrl.org/school-club-roundup and www.scr.limarc.org for the latest updates.

In the near future, we expect to have an online entry process similar to the one that is used for the Rookie Roundup.

Regardless of how you log the School Club Roundup, please send in a copy of the summary sheet. It contains more info than what is used for the scoring and is helpful in tracking how we have done from year to year. It also helps us to follow-up when there are discrepancies that may be correctible. There is an online version of the summary sheet at scr.limarc.org.

Please send any corrections or suggestions to the above e-mail address ASAP. We hope you will enter the Fall 2013 SCR, our thirty-fifth session, and make it even more successful and enjoyable than last year.

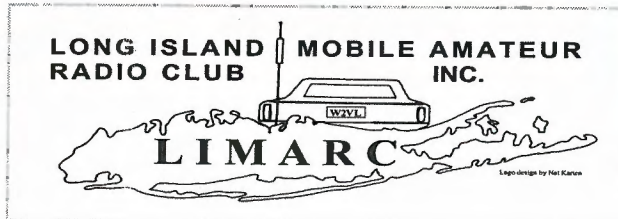
